30th Anniversary TRIP ITINERARY

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 4

Welcome aboard! Today we depart on our flight to Amsterdam. Some of us may find it difficult to sleep, but we encourage everyone to have a good rest. Anyone wishing to travel early to a European country for a few nights is welcome to do so. Please plan to arrive in Nairobi no later than 8 pm on Thursday, March 5 to join the group.

THURSDAY, MARCH 5

We connect to our flight in Amsterdam and arrive in Nairobi at 8 pm. On arrival, we will be met by our vans and guides and check into the 4 Points Sheraton.

FRIDAY, MARCH 6

After a good breakfast, we will visit the elephant orphanage and depart for our two night stay at the Sopa Naivasha Resort. We will enjoy the beautiful setting and rest from our jetlag. This is an exclusive hideout about three hours from Nairobi toward the lake country of Kenya. The resort is located on Lake Naivasha.

SATURDAY, MARCH 7

After breakfast, we will visit our newest project. After, we will drive to Elsmere Garden for lunch and a boat ride on Lake Naivasha. If you wish, a golf game followed by a walk around the Rift Valley is scheduled. Many of the world's largest lakes are located in rift valleys.

SUNDAY, MARCH 8

We will depart today for the Mara Sarova tented camp deeper into the game reserve. We will arrive at the tented camp for lunch. By virtue of its location and layout, the Camp offers an unparalleled plethora of activities and experiences.

MONDAY, MARCH 9

This morning we wake up early for a drive through the Kenyan sector of the famous Mara-Serengeti ecosystem, Kenya's most fascinating reserve. We will look for herds of elephants roaming through the jungles. After breakfast, we will visit projects and have our picnic lunch at one of our schools, then enjoy a drive back through the park and end the day visiting a Maasai village.

TUESDAY, MARCH 10

Today will be more exploration of Mara West.

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 11

Today will be an all-day game drive with a picnic lunch and, for those who wish, a hot air balloon ride. The phrase "Big Five Game" was coined by game hunters and refers to the very large mammals that were originally most sought in Africa. The collection consists of the lion, elephant, buffalo, leopard, and rhinoceros. After lunch, we will proceed to the Mara Serena Lodge. The lodge has a 360-degree view of the Mara.

THURSDAY, MARCH 12

This morning we will fly from the Mara to Nairobi and connect to a flight for Lamu Island on the coast of Kenya. Lamu Island is a world heritage site known for its architecture and slow-paced lifestyle on the coast. The island is preserved as the 16th century stopover point for people taking spices from India to Arab countries.

FRIDAY, MARCH 13

This morning we'll leave by boat to see the Lamu School for Mentally Disabled Children that ABW has been supporting for the last 10 years. This island has only 2 cars—all of our travel on this day will be done by boat, walking, or on donkeys. In the evening we will sail on a dhow to see the sunset on the Indian Ocean.

SATURDAY, MARCH 14

We'll have some time to relax and take a flight to Nairobi. Stay overnight in Nairobi and prepare for the trip to Tanzania.

SUNDAY, MARCH 15

Today we'll drive from Nairobi to Tanzania, crossing the border at Namanga. We'll stay at the base of Mount Kilimanjaro in a climbing lodge.

MONDAY, MARCH 16; TUES, MARCH 17; WED, MARCH 18

We'll drive to see some of ABW's newest projects in the mountain district of Korugwe. We will visit schools, water projects, and clinics.

THURSDAY, MARCH 19

Today we will begin our adventure to the Ngorongoro Crater, one of the most fascinating sites in Tanzania. Our hotel is located on the rim of the crater with a full view of the area from our rooms and dining hall.

FRIDAY, MARCH 20

We'll go on a safari drive into the heart of the crater to see the animals that inhabit this unique landscape.

SATURDAY, MARCH 21

Today we'll drive to the human discovery centre excavation site where humans are believed to have first been living.

SUNDAY, MARCH 22

This will be a day to relax and get ready for our flight home.
