Rotary Club TRIP ITINERARY



FRIDAY, MAY 15

Welcome aboard! Today we will all depart on our various flights to Nairobi. Some will find it difficult to sleep, but we encourage everyone to get a good rest on the plane, if possible.

SATURDAY, MAY 16

We will arrive in Nairobi in the evening. As we arrive at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport, our drivers will be waiting to take us to our hotel for the first night.

SUNDAY, MAY 17

After a good night's rest, we will drive to the David Sheldrick Elephant Orphanage just outside of Nairobi and be entertained by the resident baby elephants. In the afternoon, we will drive to the Sopa Lodge where we will be spending the next two nights.

MONDAY, MAY 18

In the morning, we will go to the Gilgil School and visit with students and staff. Most of the children are from the nearby Bondeni Slums and are from very low income families. In the afternoon we arrive at the Elsemere Camp. For those who wish to join, a boat ride on Lake Naivasha will give us a closer view of the local hippopotamus and other wildlife grazing on the shores of the lake.

TUESDAY, MAY 19

Today we will drive to Kericho for the opening of the Kipkeremwo School. The staff will be proud to show you around their new school made possible by Sunrise Rotary Club. After the opening, we will travel to our hotel. Kericho is the tea capital of Kenya. The plantations in the highlands there are among the most productive in the world and you will see many tea pickers hard at work in the green fields.

WEDNESDAY, MAY 20

In the morning, we will drive to Ndanai to visit the Ndanai Small Home, where 39 children with various disabilities live and study. There have been many improvements to Ndanai recently with support from ABW donors. You will have an opportunity to interact and visit with the children.

THURSDAY, MAY 21

We will leave the Kericho district in the morning and travel south to the edge of the beautiful Maasai Mara National Reserve. It will be a long, dusty drive on some rough roads, but it will be well worth the journey once we arrive in the Mara.

FRIDAY, MAY 22

After a good rest, we will travel through the Reserve to our next hotel, visiting several A Better World sites along the way. In the evening, we will arrive in time for a game drive and hopefully catch a glimpse of some of the large animals which call the park home.

SATURDAY, MAY 23

Today we will go to several A Better World sites where we will visit with staff and students and see the projects that have been completed there.

SUNDAY, MAY 24

An all-day game drive is planned and if we are lucky, we will encounter each of the Big Five: African buffalo, lion, leopard, rhinoceros, and elephant. We will have a nice lunch while enjoying the beautiful scenery of the Mara before travelling to our hotel.

MONDAY, MAY 25

This is your day to rest and relax and just enjoy your surroundings.

TUESDAY, MAY 26 – OPTIONAL EXTENSION TO LAMU ISLAND

Today we will make the long drive back to Nairobi in time to catch our respective late-night flights. If you wish to join us on a brief extension of this trip, we will travel from the Mara to beautiful Lamu Island, a World Heritage site on the coast of Kenya. On arrival, we will check in to our hotel before taking a spectacular sunset dhow boat cruise on the Indian Ocean.

WEDNESDAY, MAY 27

Lamu Island is a part of the Lamu Archipelago of Kenya. There are no roads on the island, but rather alleyways and footpaths, and therefore, there are few motorized vehicles on the island. Today we travel by boat to see the Lamu School. This is a school for children and young adults with special needs. The students don't have visitors often but love to welcome guests to their school.

THURSDAY, MAY 28

Sadly, today we will say our goodbyes and catch our flight to Nairobi and then each to their respective homes. We are glad that you decided to travel with us and we hope we will see you again soon!
